The first objection to the ethics of the Old Testament is that God is represented sometimes in the Old Testament as partial, fickle, hateful, revengeful, and otherwise morally unworthy. For example, in Genesis 6:57 we read that when God saw the wickedness of man it repented him that he had made him.

Four reasons for ethical study are advanced: first, from a confessional (religious/theological/devotional) standpoint, it could be maintained that the Old Testament in some sense contains the revealed will of God and that its ethical teaching therefore makes a claim upon Jews and Christians if not upon all humanity; a second reason springs from the conviction that the confessional position is mistaken and that it is the duty of scholarship to expose the crudities of Old Testament morality in ...

The Application of Old Testament Ethics. Peter's interpretation of the OT as a source for Christian ethics is mostly of the literalist variety. Also, the theme of fulfil- ment is prevalent in his use of the OT, as 1:10-12 indicates. This is one of the clearest statements of the peshertype of interpretation.

The milestone-like character of Old Testament (OT) ethics meets us at almost every turn. Certainly the task of establishing ethical norms is made most problematic by OT material and therefore deserves major attention. Ethics in the Bible refers to the system or theory produced by the study, interpretation, and evaluation of biblical morals,, that are found in the Hebrew and Christian Bibles. It comprises a narrow part of the larger fields of Jewish and Christian ethics, which are themselves parts of the larger field of philosophical ethics. Ethics in the Bible is unlike other western ethical theories in that it is seldom overtly philosophical. It presents neither a systematic nor a formal deductive ethical ar
