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Chopin Nocturne Analysis

Chopin's Nocturne in C sharp minor is a short piece – about 3.5 minutes long. By today's pop music standards that would be considered normal, but it was short against the backdrop of Classical music. This particular nocturne was written in 1830 but wasn't published until 1870, 26 years after Chopin's death.

The Nocturnes Op 9 are a set of three nocturnes written by Frédéric Chopin. Chopin wrote this particular nocturne at the age of 20! Nocturne Opus 9, No. 2 has a time signature of 12/8 meaning that there are 12 quaver beats per bar. The nocturne opens with a legato melody. Chopin's Nocturne Opus 9, No.2's song structure is a rounded binary form with coda.

That is a great transition in one of my favorite nocturnes. One thing I would focus on with Chopin is chromaticism. Especially in this section, you can hear more of a chromatic descend (especially looking at the bass notes). In the Alto voice in the second measure, look at how it goes from D-C#-C-B-flat, and A-Aflat-G in the bass following suit.

Chopin composed his best-known Nocturne in E-flat major, Op. 9, No. 2 when he was around twenty years old. This well-known nocturne is in rounded binary form (A, A, B, A, B, A) with coda , C. It is 34 measures long and written in 12/8 meter, having a similar structure to a waltz .
