### How Can We Treat Traumatized Children? | Psychology Today

Help your child avoid situations that trigger traumatic memories, at least until more healing has occurred. Be emotionally and physically available. Some traumatized children act in ways that keep adults at a distance (whether they mean to or not). Provide attention, comfort, and encouragement in ways your child will accept.

### Helping Traumatized Children Caregivers Perry

CBT and other trauma-focused techniques can help children with cognitive distortions related to the trauma, such as self-blame, develop more adaptive understanding and perceptions of the trauma. Like all clinical work, the quality of the therapeutic relationships among therapist, child, and parents/caretakers is the foundation for treatment of trauma.

That's not to say your child will be emotionally scarred for life if they endure a horrific experience. But it's important to recognize when your child may need professional help with dealing with trauma. Early intervention may even prevent your child from experiencing the ongoing effects of the trauma as an adult.

### The Effects of Childhood Trauma and What Can Help ...

Early childhood trauma generally refers to the traumatic experiences that occur to children aged 0-6. Because infants' and young children's reactions may be different from older children's, and because they may not be able to verbalize their reactions to threatening or dangerous events, many people assume that young age protects children from the impact of traumatic experiences.

To help a child recover from trauma, it's important to communicate openly. Let them know that it's normal to feel scared or upset.
