Milligan-Morgan haemorrhoidectomy is considered to be the gold-standard approach for grade IV haemorrhoids. An increasing number of minimally invasive treatment options, including mucopexy with or without mucosal resection and haemorrhoid artery ligation, have now been proposed for the management of grade III haemorrhoids.

Conservative and surgical treatment of haemorrhoids

A surgery to treat a single small hemorrhoid using sclerotherapy may result in minor pain. A hemorrhoidectomy to remove multiple very large hemorrhoids may result in significant pain. Regardless of the type of treatment, it is normal to have pain with a bowel movement in the week following surgery.

Recovering After Hemorrhoid Surgery Treatment

Home treatments include: Use of non-prescription haemorrhoid ointments, creams, suppositories, or pads containing a mild corticosteroid, e.g. hydrocortisone, or witch hazel extract Soaking the anal area in warm water for 10 to 15 minutes two or three times a day Using stool softeners, which help stools to be passed more easily

The avoidance of constipation and straining on bowel movements is most important in the treatment of hemorrhoids. The ideal is to have bulky soft, well-formed stools without the need to strain to evacuate. Minor degrees of hemorrhoids will respond to increased fluid and fiber intake alone. Laxatives which may cause diarrhea may worsen hemorrhoids.

Non-Surgical Treatment of Hemorrhoids

Surgical hemorrhoidectomy, which is the surgical removal of the hemorrhoid. It is extremely effective but has a painful recovery period that typically lasts two to three weeks after the surgery. Hemorrhoid band ligation, a non-surgical procedure where the hemorrhoid is suctioned with a small device, and a rubber band is placed at the end of the hemorrhoid.

Results: Currently available surgical treatment options include procedure for prolapse and hemorrhoids (PPH), transanal hemorrhoidal dearterialization (THD), and conventional hemorrhoidectomy techniques.
